The fourth episode of Sparefroh TV, including teaching materials, is available with immediate effect. Sparefroh TV has been developed in close cooperation with the federal ministry of education, arts and culture. The content is appropriate for the age group and is designed according to pedagogical guidelines. In addition to the videos, teaching materials for the 3rd and 4th grade have been created with the support of the Polis Center for Citizenship Education in Schools and the Initiative for Teaching Entrepreneurship (IFTE). "We want that children become independent adults who can make sound decisions – especially in connection with their own finances", says Thomas Uher, member of the management board, "but that also requires that we make it possible for them to learn the basics." In the online shop of thePolis Center, the book as well as all teaching materials and the DVD are available to teachers for free.



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How Does a Company Work?

In episode four of Sparefroh TV, everything to do with working in a company is explained in a manner appropriate for children. Kati, Klaus and Sparefroh, examine why one must actually work, what type of work arises in a company, and what the significance of further training and retirement is. In episodes 1 – 3 of Sparefroh TV the questions "Where Does Money Come From?", "What Do I Buy Myself?" and "How Does the Market Work?" are answered.

Financial Literacy for Children, Youth and Adults
